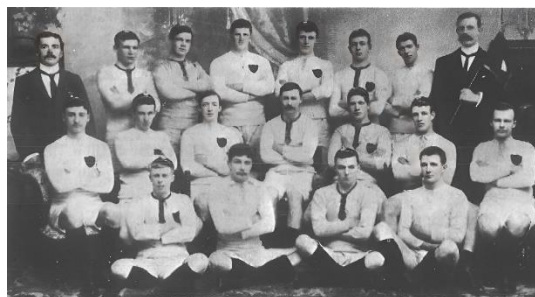

## 2. President's Report



Having served three years as OBU's President, I have to say what a pleasure and honour it has been. The total time I have been President Covid has had a big influence on club rugby. Last year we only had one Colts team and I put that down to Victoria University providing courses on-line & not having O-Week. Also, there being over 1,000 less students on site. 2023 should get us back to two Colts' teams.

The premier team having lost sixteen players from the previous season played their first game of the season against Petone with thirteen plays out with Covid or because they were a close contact with someone who had covid. Players missing because of covid continued throughout the season. The Premier team also had over 30 players making their OBU Premier team debut, making it tough for team cohesion.

On a better note I was fortunate to have the Premier win the jubilee Cup and Swindale Shield on my watch. The Colts green also won the championship twice and Colt Black once.

One of the highlights of the season was the luncheon we held in Auckland and it was great to see so many ex-players living in Auckland attend. The luncheon turned out to be a good fund raiser for the club and everyone was enthusiastic for us to have more events in Auckland.

2022 saw us farewell both Patrons – Grant Guilford (VUW) and Gregor Fountain (Wellington College) and welcome one new Patron – Glen Denham (Wellington College) and at the time of writing have a Patron in- waiting – Prof Nic Smith (VUW) who will be taking up his appointment as Vice Chancellor in January 2023.

On a disappointing note, no OBU team won their grade in either round this season. This is only the second time this has happened in the history of our club. The last time being 1996. On the positive side, Callum Harken won the Billy Wallace Best and Fairest – only Sam Reid (OBU 2020). Fraser Mexted (WCOB 1985) and Tu Wylie (VUW 1980) have achieved this previously. Well Done, Callum. I would also like to congratulate Caleb Delaney on making the Hurricanes and NZ Māori.

Financing Rugby clubs is getting more and difficult. This year we have lost our major sponsor of the last two years, Jardens. I would like to thank Jardens for their financial support and wish them all the best & hope a renewal of this partnership can happen in the future. We have been knocked back by a number of funders who have supported us in the past and they say it is due to lack of support of their revenue streams due to covid.

This is the year we need to increase our supporter base and I ask all old players and supporters to please pay a non-playing member subscription.

A new President will take over at this year's AGM and I wish him all the best.



### Description of Entity's Outcomes

#### Community Involvement

Wellington College Old Boys & Victoria University Rugby Football Club Inc by way of rugby union and off-field development programmes such as our Academy aim to contribute to the health, well being and fitness in our community, and assist our children, youth and young adults in a variety of backgrounds providing a positive impact across many areas of our community.

#### Youth Development & Education

Wellington College Old Boys & Victoria University Rugby Football Club Inc is one of New Zealand's largest rugby clubs with over 500 registered players, Life Members, Vice Presidents, coaches, managers and other volunteers & supporters. The players are spread across 7 senior teams. In addition, Wellington College Old Boys & Victoria University of Wellington Rugby Football Club Inc has an Academy in conjunction with Victoria University of Wellington & the Jack Jeffs Trust which takes a holistic approach to our student player's academic, well being and physical development. The Academy has been growing and has contributed significantly to the Club overall. It needs to be noted that like all sports, playing membership was severely cut due to Covid policies and issues that affected the ability of people to participate. This resulted in the loss of a Women's team, an additional Colts team and the amalgamation of two Reserve Grade teams. It's also to be noted that female athletes were still admitted to the Academy with a view to reinstate this (and other teams) in the 2023 season.

## 4.8 Notes to the Performance Report

### Wellington College Old Boys & Victoria University of Wellington Rugby Football Club Inc For the year ended 31 August 2022

#### 1. Statement of Accounting Policies

##### Reporting entity

The performance report presented here is for the entity Wellington College Old Boys & Victoria University Rugby Football Club Inc, incorporated under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

##### Nature of business

The entity is engaged in providing services as a rugby union club. The nature of the entity's business has not changed during the year under review.

##### Basis of Preparation

The entity has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in these financial statements are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. This performance report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

##### Historical cost

This performance report has been prepared on a historical cost basis.

##### Presentation Currency

The Performance Report is presented in New Zealand dollars (NZ\$) and all values are rounded to the nearest NZ\$.

##### Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies. Policies have been applied on a consistent basis with those of the previous reporting period.

##### Revenue Recognition

Donations and grants with no "use or return" condition attached are recorded as revenue when cash is received.

Donations and grants with a "use or return" condition attached are recorded as a liability when cash is received, and as the conditions are met the liability is reduced and revenue is recorded.

Donated goods or services are not recorded.

Fundraising revenue is recorded when cash is received (is no "use or return" condition is attached"). Fees and subscriptions from members are recorded in the year to which it relates.

Interest income is recorded as it is earned.

##### Trade Receivables

Trade receivables are initially measured at the amount owed. When it is likely that the amount owed, or some portion, will not be collected, an impairment adjustment is recorded. Interest charged on overdue amounts are added to the individual debtor balance

## 4.8 Notes to the Performance Report (contd.)

### Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the entity has an obligation which can be reliably measured at balance date as a result of a past event and it is probable that the company will be required to settle the obligation.

Provisions are measured at the present value of management's best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the obligation at balance date. Movements in the best estimate are recorded in the Statement of Financial Performance.

### Loans

Loans are recorded when the amount borrowed has been received and measured at cost. Interest expense is recognised on an accruals basis.

### Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

### Income Tax

Wellington College Old Boys & Victoria University of Wellington Rugby Football Club Inc is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Depreciation is calculated on a straight line / diminishing value basis over the estimated useful life of the asset. The following estimated depreciation rates /useful lives have been used:

Plant and equipment 16% - 50% SL & DV

An item of property, plant and equipment or investment property is derecognised upon disposal or when no further future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Any gain or loss arising on derecognition of the asset (calculated as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset) is included in the Statement of Financial Performance in the year the asset is derecognised.

### 8. Going Concern

The Club is reliant to a degree on external funding (including grants and sponsorship). A deficit of \$1,576 was incurred in the year to 31 August 2022. If funding does not continue at required levels the Club may be unable to settle debts as they fall due and

- b) the preparation and fair presentation of the performance report in accordance with Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting – Accrual (Not-For-Profit) Standard issued in New Zealand by the New Zealand Accounting Standards Board, and
- c) for such internal control as the Executive Committee determine is necessary to enable the preparation of the performance report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

#### Assurance Practitioner's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the performance report. We conducted our review of the financial information (consisting of the statement of financial performance, statement of financial position, statement of cash flows, statement of accounting policies and notes to the performance report) in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements (New Zealand) (ISRE (NZ)) 2400, "Review of Historical Financial Statements Performed by an Assurance Practitioner who is not the Auditor of the Entity", and the review of the non-financial information (consisting of the entity information and statement of service performance) in accordance with the International Standard on Assurance Engagements (New Zealand) ISAE (NZ) 3000 (Revised). Those standards require us to conclude whether anything has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the performance report, taken as a whole, is not prepared in all material respects in accordance with the Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting – Accrual (Not-For-Profit) Standard. Those standards also require that we comply with ethical requirements.

A review of the Performance Report in accordance with ISRE (NZ) 2400 and ISAE (NZ) 3000 (Revised) is a limited assurance engagement. A review of the statement of service performance also involves performing procedures to obtain evidence and evaluating the suitability of the reported outcomes, outputs and quantification methods used. We performed procedures, primarily consisting of making enquiries of management and others within the entity, as appropriate, and applied analytical procedures, and evaluated the evidence obtained. The procedures selected depend on our judgement, including the areas identified where a material misstatement is likely to arise.

The procedures performed in a review are substantially less than those performed in an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand) and ISAE (NZ) 3000 (Revised). Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion on the performance report.

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that this performance report does not present fairly, in all material respects, the entity information and the financial position of Wellington College Old Boys & Victoria University Rugby Football Club Inc as at 31 August 2022 and its financial performance, cash flows and service performance for the year then ended in accordance with Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting – Accrual (Not-For-Profit) Standard.

### **Emphasis of Matter**

We draw attention to Note 8 in the performance report, which states that the Wellington College Old Boys & Victoria University Rugby Football Club Inc incurred a deficit in the year to 31 August 2022 of \$9,126. As stated in Note 8, these events or conditions, along with other matters as set forth in Note 8, indicate that a material uncertainty exists that may cast significant doubt on the Wellington College Old Boys & Victoria University Rugby Football Club Inc's ability to continue as a going concern. Our conclusion is not modified in respect of this matter.

## 6. WRFU Delegate's Report



As the OBU delegate on the Wellington Rugby Football Union Rugby Board it is my responsibility to represent not just the interests of our club, but also the best interests of Rugby in Wellington.

I largely viewed my first year in the role as an opportunity to understand the lay of the land and get a handle of the various club perspectives and identities. The following soon became clear:

- Every member of the Rugby Board is deeply passionate about not just their club, but also Rugby in Wellington
- There are multiple areas in club rugby that need to be addressed including declining volunteerism, a shortage of referees and challenges associated with generating revenue
- There must be a renewed focus on ALL levels of club rugby to ensure there are complete player pathways for participants of all ages and abilities
- Club Rugby would not exist without the current generation of volunteers who have devoted their life to the game – we must find a way to inspire the next generation

In terms of specific items for the Rugby Board, there were several, and I have listed these below.

### **Silverlake Investment**

There was confirmation mid-way through the season that clubs would receive \$10,000 - \$40,000 based on their total playing numbers. OBU is eligible for \$30,000 and this money will be ring-fenced for future investments.

### **Covid-19**

While the 2022 season was the first full season of rugby in several years, there were still several challenges associated with Covid-19 including abiding by Government guidelines, fielding teams amidst illness and/or isolation requirements, and everchanging by-laws. One can only hope that the 2023 season is totally unimpacted!

### **Community Rugby Forums**

Wellington Rugby initiated a series of club Rugby forums with the intention of identifying "What is the purpose of Community Rugby". While it is still early days, key priorities were identified as ensuring Rugby is fun, safe and welcoming, inclusive for all, and accessible for all. This work will continue over the coming months and OBU will ensure our members continue to be represented.

I would like to extend thanks to the Wellington Rugby Football Union staff for their support as well as acknowledging the contributions of our fellow clubs and their respective delegates. I would also like to mention referees across the region who often toil away in less than savoury conditions!

Finally, I want to extend thanks to all members of the OBU family whether it be players, volunteers, coaches, sponsors or administrators – you all have a role to play making this club what it is now, and into the future and your support is greatly appreciated. If you believe your expertise can help the club in any way, please reach out!

## 10. NZ Universities Rugby Council Delegate's Report



It was a year of positive progression for New Zealand Universities rugby in 2022 with the establishment of the New Zealand Universities Women's rugby team and the continuation of the NZU Men's team in the post covid era.

The Men's team, represented by Jack Riley and Te Wehi Wright from OBU, played two games with the first being against Ellesmere Sub-union XV played in Prebbleton outside of CHCH. NZU Men put on a dominant performance to win the game 54-26 in a match that was played with true University skill, speed and flair.

The second game was a tougher assignment against a polished South Canterbury outfit, fresh from a successful Heartland campaign. After a fast start, the game turned into a tight one with lots of ebbs and flows. At half time NZU led 26-21 but in the 2nd half SC dominated possession and territory. With 15 mins to go, they led 35-26, but NZU took it right to the final seconds but just came up short 33-35. A good game played in excellent spirit and on the superb ground at Pleasant Point Domain.

The first against a combined 'Cantabrians' team and the second against the New Zealand Defence Force Women's team, in a landmark fixture. The Cantabrians won a nail-biting encounter in 31-25 in what was a great display of attacking rugby. The result of the NZU Women's "test match" v NZ Defence Force at the UCRC's home ground, NZ Defence Force won by 31 points to 17, in a very entertaining and well played match. NZU scored the first and last tries in the game which was played in very good spirit.

The spirit and unity shown by the first ever NZU Women's team was outstanding as they define their culture and come together as a team. The squad was made up of many Farrah Palmer Cup players from across the constituent clubs and the attraction of the NZU jersey to these top players, very heartening.

## Women's Development

Women's rugby has been a very challenging area for OBU and the academy in recent years. With a large amount of experienced players not returning for the 2022 season, the effects of covid continued to ripple within the club.

Competent coaches and managers to help assist improving Women's rugby is currently limited. Assistance is required from Wellington Rugby to lead the club on best practice to promote, recruit and retain female players.

The club echo's the sentiment that OBU should have a women's team, who are currently using the sevens programme to recruit women's participants first and then hopefully draw enough numbers for a 15's team. However, the club and the academy understands this is going to be a huge challenge.

OBU and the Academy are keen to engage in more conversations about strategies and planning women's rugby. They hope WRFU and the University can also assist with visible pathways for female rugby players.

## Strength and Conditioning

The Strength and Conditioning programme was split into four blocks. The first block focused on general preparation, developing the individual's general muscle size and strength.

The second training block split them into two categories, Hypertrophy/Strength and Strength/Power development. Following fitness testing and the general prep block, athletes were assigned to either group based upon their testing results, training age, movement competency, and body composition.

The last two blocks focused on strength and power. This showed in their second round of fitness testing, with the majority of the players making significant improvements in their fitness testing results.

## Technical Training

The Technical training component of the Academy continued to be well-received by participants in 2022, however there were some difficulties in being able to secure volunteer support from coaches due to Covid continuing to affect the environment.

Another challenge is the inability to cater to the different needs of position specific skills, with just the one specialist coach leading the sessions.

This being said, the technical sessions are a crucial part to develop and educate their specific on-field rugby skills. Being able to practice repetition of micro skills they are not able to do at rugby training is a big advantage.

## 2023/ Future Recommendations:

- Investment in sport science equipment to better assess and monitor the athletes
- Athlete monitoring software to allow us to track the athlete's progress.
- Timing gates to monitor other fitness characteristics such as speed, or velocity-based training equipment to assess power and monitor fatigue.
- More guest speakers and high-performance guests to ensure there is a sufficient amount of player development sessions throughout the programme.
- More resources put in to developing women's rugby within the Club and the University to increase a larger female presence within the Academy.
- Female coach/es working together with Academy coach and S&C trainer.
- The possibility of having three morning sessions a week instead of two. This may impact the budget if Anton is used for the third session.
- Keep the number of athletes to 18 maximum, as it is more manageable to keep closely connected to players during their season and still be able to provide the holistic focus that makes the Academy unique.
- Boyd-Wilson classroom recovery/ physio room completed and ready to go for 2023.
- Utilise OBU's home base for opening ceremony and University space for closing ceremony.

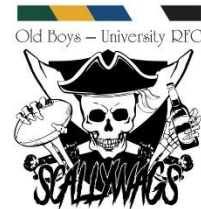

## 13. Premier



Taking over as Head Coach of the Old Boys University premier side for 2022 had its challenges from the start with many players from the previous year choosing to retire or relocating to a different province or country. The total player pool was in the twenties. I was fortunate and privileged to have Tomasi Palu (OBU director of rugby), Glynn Champion, Anton Jacques (Trainer) Perenise Ropeti, John Hewitt, Brad Houlahan, Phoebe Ferguson (Club Captain), and Greg Mullany (Premier Reserves Coach) in the management crew and it was decided we had to change how things were run in the past. For example, starting pre-season a lot earlier and approaching training differently with both premier teams training together on a Tuesday night and splitting on Thursdays. This created the concept of the 'One Herd'.

The highlights in the first round were wins against Ponoka (Algar Rosebowl), Wellington (Gifford Cup), Wainuiomata (Dunford Cup), and the Bill Brien Challenge Cup (Oriental Rongotai). We had narrow losses to Northern United, Petone and Marist St Pats. ## 14. Premier Reserve



### **Ability to accomplish responsibilities**

The 2022 season started off very promisingly with an awesome pre-season and a great start to the Harper Lock shield first round ran by the premier coaching staff. In the premier reserves we recorded two wins in the first up two games of the season. This automatically set us up for a second-round qualification of the top eight for the Ed Chaney cup round. To follow on from the positives we also drew with both the two finalist teams in the Ed Chaney cup while recording three drawn results and a one-point loss to finish the season. Another highlight was the amount of players that we produced debuting for the premiers this season and the premier coaches showing the faith in a great number of new debutants not only from the prem reserves but from across the club.

Unfortunately, due to injuries, unavailability's and illness we struggled to field a consistent team sheet each week. We topped the player count using over 75 players this season which was resourceful and encouraging but created a challenging environment. This led to a string of inconsistent results mixed in with some heavy defeats for the premier reserves this season. The one herd approach that we took this year helped us to field quality teams each week and utilize young players that were continuing to develop which was a great bonus. This approach also helped in training together, increasing the standard of developing premier reserve players but also raising the Rugby IQ of squad members in the preview/review sessions that were held together also.

### **Goal achievements**

This year we achieved our goal of making the second round Ed Chaney top eight qualification. We were aiming to go one step further this year and finish in the top four but were unsuccessful with that pursuit. Finishing 8<sup>th</sup> this year out of eight teams in the second round was not where we wanted to be but positively leaves the door open for a great deal of improvement which is a silver lining.

### **Suggested areas of improvement**

Areas of improvement for us are to create some consistency with our match day squad. This would help produce consistent player personnel to build solid combinations leading to better performances on field. Another area of improvement in the performance of our game would also be our defence. Due to the nature of bigger and more abrasive opposition, our tackle technique be better and we need at least two men in the tackle to stop oppositions creating go forward momentum. Our defensive line connection and execution in the tackle led to more tries than we'd hoped to be scored against us but making these small but helpful adjustments should lead to some better results.

### **Demonstration of Core values**

All in all we were very proud and happy with the men that wore the goat jersey in the Prem Reserves this year. The players themselves displayed and emulated the values and character that makes us one of the best clubs in Wellington. The effort along with the perseverance through testing times were some of our most valued attributes. The goat mentality is something we talk about repeatedly as a wider premier coaching group in this drives a standard of excellence that asks players to hold themselves accountable. This characteristic was greatly displayed this year from not only the premier group but ourselves also which was a promising sign for the future.

I'd particularly like to thank Paul Swift, Chris Whitley and Ren Walker for their great efforts in helping to coaching and managing the team – much appreciated!

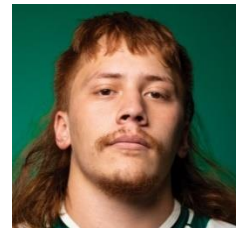

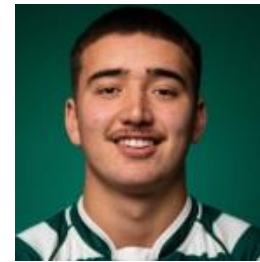
